## Betrayal and Guilt

The betrayal is in the hands of the betrayer. It is not ours to own and it does not place guilt on our shoulders. The enemy wants us to believe it must be our fault and that we deserved the betrayal, but this is the enemy's favorite way to use his masterful lies.

*... He was a murderer from the beginning. He has always hated the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he lies, it is consistent with his character; for he is a liar and the father of lies. John 8:44 (NLT)*

What lies of guilt from the enemy have you allowed yourself to listen to or believe about this betrayal/s?

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Now rewrite those lies as truth.

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*Dear Jesus,*

*Thank You for being the writer of all truth. Thank You for being Truth and the victor over both lies and the author of lies. I have allowed myself to hear the whispering lies of the enemy and hold them in my heart as truth. But right now, I repent of this because believing lies is contrary to Your Word. I know that each time I believed a lie, I grieved Your heart. Lord, I am claiming Your truth today and with Your Name, the Name of Jesus, I am canceling out the lies of the enemy. I am laying the lies down and picking up truth. I am a child of God and I know that the betrayal I suffered was at the hands of a broken person. Lord, I ask You to heal and bless that person right now. May they come to know You and Your healing power so that they can live a life of freedom that is free from hurting others again.*

*In the name of Jesus I pray.*

## Betrayal and Identity

Betrayal is not our identity. When we are betrayed we can find ourselves harboring feelings of unworthiness. We hear the enemy whisper things like, “You are not worth being respected” and “You were a fool.” People, however, do not betray based upon the worth or level of awareness of those

*Jesus answered, “It is the one to whom I will give this piece of bread when I have dipped it in the dish.” Then, dipping the piece of bread, he gave it to Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot. As soon as Judas took the bread, Satan entered into him. John 13:26-27*

*Dear Jesus,*

*Thank You for making me in the image of You and for calling me wonderful. Just as You did not take the sins of Judas as a definition of Your worth, I refuse to take the sins of another's betrayal as the definition of my worth. My worth is defined by You and You call me wonderful. I repent of believing the lies of the enemy and choose to believe You and only You. Lord, I ask You to open my eyes to the difference between truth and lies so that I can lay the lies at Your feet and not question my identity anymore.*

*In Your precious name I pray.*

## Betrayal and Unconditional Acceptance

We must unconditionally accept the fact that life is not fair and injustice happens. We cannot avoid it nor is it in our power to stop betrayal. It is only in our power to trust that God will walk us through betrayal.

*When Adam sinned, sin entered the world. Adam's sin brought death, so death spread to everyone, for everyone sinned. Romans 5:12*

Do you have a steel wall of sorts built around your heart because you are afraid to invest or get too close to someone? Are you trying desperately to avoid betrayal? Where do you see this in your life?

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On the other hand, are there people or relationships in your life where there are red flags or that feeling in the back of your tummy that says this person may be dangerous? Do you need to set a boundary in those situations?

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*Dear Jesus,*

*You so marvelously designed me to be in community. My heart is wired to love and to connect. I know that Your desire is for those relationships to resemble Your love, but because of the sin that has set its course amongst all people, betrayal is a hurt I must encounter as I love others. But You, my ever faithful God, are there in the midst of that hurt. You are there to pick me up and hold me tight. Redeeming every ache and hurt I suffer. Lord, I ask You to fill me with wisdom to discern safe and unsafe people. Let me see others with open eyes and feel when You nudge me to recognize the red flags. Let me then use Your strength to draw firm boundaries. But Lord, when You call me into community, I bravely and authentically enter into that relationship knowing full well that whatever may result will be worked to Your glory. Please break down any steel walls I may have erected so that I can continue to fully love my neighbors even in the face of betrayal.*

*In the Name of Jesus I pray.*

## Betrayal and Revenge

Revenge will not make betrayal better. It will only make our own brokenness greater. We may never personally witness any type of justice, but our faith assures us that the Lord will take care of the matter.

*Do not say, "I will repay evil"; Wait [expectantly] for the Lord, and He will rescue and save you. Proverbs 20:22 (AMP)*

Are there current or past situations of betrayal that you are privately contemplating or seeking revenge? If so, is this thought process resolving the ache in your heart? Or is it merely giving relief to the surface level anger of your flesh?

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Is there a situation that is wreaking havoc within your soul and growing bitterness? Do you need to lay down your right to see justice in order to stop the growing bitterness? Is there a situation that you need to let go of and be okay knowing that in His time, God will see justice through?

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*Dear Jesus,*

*You know the depths of my heart. You know the places I have extended forgiveness and you know the areas I am hanging onto a desire to take justice into my own hands. Lord, I ask for Your forgiveness for my thoughts, ideas, or actions of revenge. I know that revenge is contrary to Your Word and I know it is not what You desire for me. I boldly ask You to take that desire of revenge from me.*

*I ask You to fill my spirit with complete disdain for the idea of revenge. Instead, fill it with the courage to trust You with justice. I want to be free of the root of bitterness that is growing in my heart and instead glorify You with joy and kindheartedness. May my story of surrender and trust only magnify You and glorify Your holy Name. Thank You for Your grace. Your care. Your promise of justice.*

## Betrayal and Lessons Learned

Betrayal stinks. But, it will also allow us the opportunity to grow. Simply being able to look betrayal in the eye and say, "I will grow from this", is defeating the intent of the betrayer – the intent of the enemy. When we recognize that on the other side of this betrayal lies a healed heart and newfound joy, we become victors through Christ and over darkness.

*"When a woman gives birth, she has a hard time, there's no getting around it. But when the baby is born, there is joy in the birth. This new life in the world wipes out memory of the pain. The sadness you have right now is similar to that pain, but the coming joy is also similar. When I see you again, you'll be full of joy, and it will be a joy no one can rob from you. You'll no longer be so full of questions. John 16:21-23*

*Dear Jesus,*

*I thank You that You have armed me for the battle. Your Word says that You are made strong in my weakness, so I thank You for being what and where I am not. My reaction is to draw away from betrayal. To not feel the hurt. I don't like to suffer. But Lord, I hold onto Your promises that tell me I can walk through the suffering and I will have have a new strength and a new joy. Even when, to my eyes, it doesn't seem possible, I am claiming the promise of that new joy and strength. And just as a Mother's pain is wiped out by the joy of the birth of her child, I too, will open my eyes to the joy available in the midst of my pain. Lord, I ask You to help me look to You in this time. Keep my eyes planted firmly on You and help me to feel Your strength, compassion, love, comfort, and hope as You walk alongside me. May You take my pain and give me a story that will point to the glory of Your Name.*

## Betrayal and Living Again

We will trust again. Love again. Find joy again.

*I'm not saying that I have this all together, that I have it made. But I am well on my way, reaching out for Christ, who has so wondrously reached out for me. Friends, don't get me wrong: By no means do I count myself an expert in all of this, but I've got my eye on the goal, where God is beckoning us onward—to Jesus. I'm off and running, and I'm not turning back. Philippians 3:12-14 The Message*

What goal do you have your eyes on? Is your focus on the betrayal at hand or on the goal to which God is beckoning you?

You know my need in this situation and I believe Your promise to provide for that need and to heal what has been broken. I am tired of not living life to its fullest. You came so that I could have not only eternal life, but life here to its fullest. I am ready to live again. Lord, I boldly ask You to give me what I need to trust again, to love again, and to experience joy again. Peel away the protective walls I have built around myself and fill me up once again.*

## Betrayal and the Church

Betrayal represents people as a whole. All people both in and out of the Church. Most definitely there is and will be betrayal in the church, but that does not mean betrayal is the church.

*Then Judas Iscariot, one of the twelve disciples, went to the leading priests and asked, "How much will you pay me to betray Jesus to you?" And they gave him thirty pieces of silver. From that time on, Judas began looking for an opportunity to betray Jesus. Matthew 26: 14-16 NLT*

Undoubtedly, there has been a time in your life that you have been betrayed by someone in the Church. What did that experience leave you feeling about your Church?

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If there was betrayal within the select group of 12 that Jesus chose as His disciples, how can there not be betrayal within the hundreds, if not thousands within our churches today? Is there a part of us that has made the church our idol, believing that is infallible and that sin is stopped at the doors? Is there a possibility of reframing your disappointment so that it is reflective of individuals who are fully human and fully susceptible to sin rather than of the Church as a whole?

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*Dear Jesus,*

*I thank You for creating the Church. You created us with a wiring to be in community with others. You also knew that we would need fellow believers to cheer us along the road of life and help us to stay true to Your path. You are the head of the Church and Your desire for it is to be a place to worship You and serve others in love. But our sin messes all that up. Within our churches are those who come fueled with envy and rivalry. They are members of leadership and of the body. Lord, I ask You to protect our leaders from the attacks of the enemy. I know full well that he would love nothing more than to stop them from increasing Your Name and bringing forth new believers. He would love to see their character slashed and their motives destroyed. But I pray for Your hedge of protection around our Pastors and their families. I also pray for a spirit of discernment within our leadership as they hire new staff and as they raise up new servant ministers. Let their spirits be sensitive to divisive or corrupt spirits that have come with the wrong motives. Protect the humble of spirit. Protect those who want nothing more than to serve and love You with their whole heart, soul, and mind. For those who have been hurt, I ask for their healing right now and that, in the Name of Jesus, they be freed from the chains of betrayal. That the enemy does not win by keeping them out of the church and out of community. I thank You for Your grace, Your hope, and Your redemption.*
